Agenda Item: Presentations by following Agencies:

1. Older Adult Service/Home Delivered Meals  
Presentation by Mindy Haglund & Jaime Albergo. 2022 funding request: \$6,000.  
Older Adult Services' mission is to enrich the quality of life of the older adult through a full range of services that appropriately responds to the person as he/she experiences needs and desires along the aging continuum. Older Adult Services offers community-based programs for adults and older adults. These programs are in Maine Township and serve the primary and secondary service areas of Advocate Lutheran General Hospital.

2. Orchard Village  
Presentation by Susan Kaufman. 2022 funding request: \$1,000.  
Orchard Village partners with families and communities to optimize personal outcomes for individuals with developmental disabilities through a community-integrated approach. A 501(c)3 organization located in Skokie, Illinois, Orchard Village is committed to enhancing the quality of life for people with disabilities by protecting and nurturing their right to control their own destiny.

3. Northwest Suburban Day Care Center  
Presentation by Debbie Payne & Kate Uyechi. 2022 funding request: \$50,000.  
The Northwest Suburban Day Care Center is a not-for-profit organization providing high-quality, affordable pre-school to low income families through the IL Department of Human Services Child Care Assistance Program. Their services are provided year-round, on a sliding fee scale to children ages 15 months to five years, thus enabling the parents to maintain full time employment or attend school. They promote a community-wide referral system to help parents and children in time of need.

4. Family Behavioral Health Clinic - Maryville  
Presentation by Fred Smith. 2022 funding request: \$16,000.

The Maryville Behavioral Health Clinic provides behavioral health services to children, adolescents, adults and families. Services include use disorder counseling and recovery, court mandated anger management, DUI risk education and counseling and mental health services. The clinic is open 6 days a week, accessible by public transportation and accepts Medicaid.

5. Leyden Family Service and Mental Health Center

Presentation by Bruce Sewick and Jennifer Hamilton. 2022 funding request: \$60,000.

Leyden Family Service is a 501c3 Joint Commission, accredited Community Mental Health Center providing a broad array of Behavioral Health Services to adults, adolescents and children. Leyden provides Crisis services for adults and children, Outpatient Mental Health, Psychosocial Rehabilitation, Transitional Living, and Peer Support Center Programs for those with serious and persistent mental illness.

They also have two new programs The Living Room and Transitional Community Care and Support Programs. The Agency collaborates with the Greater Chicago Food Depository and serve as a Food Pantry.

6. Life Span

Presentation by Amy Fox. 2022 funding request: \$10,000.

Agency mission is to empower survivors of domestic and sexual violence to demand safety as a human right. They ensure responsive and appropriate treatment and delivery of services to survivors of abuse. Life Span is a client-centered organization whose aim is to change social attitudes toward domestic violence through accountability, community engagement, and systemic advocacy.

7. Peer Services, Inc.

Presentation by Maureen McDonnell. 2022 funding request: \$15,000.

Peer Services has been providing substance abuse prevention, early intervention and treatment services to residents of northern Cook County since. They are licensed to provide substance abuse treatment by the Illinois Department of Human Services Division of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse. They are accredited by the Joint Commission.

Services include substance use disorder for teens, young adults, working parents and older adults, intensive outpatient treatment for adult assessment, early intervention, DUI risk education, prevention services for local schools and communities and drug testing services.
