CATALYTIC CONVERTER ETCHING, Thursday, April 25, 2024 from 3 pm to 6 pm

You have probably heard that thefts of vehicle catalytic converters have become a nationwide problem because there are precious metals found in these anti-pollution devices – namely, platinum, palladium, and rhodium. These metals are expensive because there is high demand and limited supply globally. Thieves can make anywhere from \$25 to \$300 for a standard catalytic converter, while ones from hybrid vehicles can sell for up to \$1,400.

You can deter thieves from stealing your catalytic converter by attending our event where employees of the Sheriff of Cook County will etch your Vehicle's Identification Number on your catalytic converter and also paint it red so as to alert potential thieves that your catalytic converter has been so marked. An etched catalytic converter enables law enforcement to track the converters, which in turn can lead police to the thieves.

Pre-registration for this event is required. Please register with the Sheriff's office by emailing Ccso.communityengagement@ ccsheriff.org or by calling our office at 847-297-2510 ext. 251. In order to register, you will need to submit your Name, Zip Code, Vehicle Identification number, and the Make/Model/Year of your vehicle.

SPRING CLEANING

Once again, Maine Township will hold a trio of FREE spring events to help you clean your house of unwanted paper, electronics, and items too large to fit in your trash bins. All of these events are limited to Maine Township residents and will last until the time indicated or until capacity has been reached.

Electronics Recycling on Saturday, May 18, from 9 am to 12 pm

We will accept up to five electronic items from each residential address, including no more than one television. Please no commercial/business items – only residential electronics. This event will be held in the Maine Township parking lot at 1700 Ballard Road.

"Dumpster Days" on Friday and Saturday, June 7 and 8

On Friday, June 7, a dumpster will be available on Emerson Street between Hamlin Avenue and Dee Road from 7 am and 7 pm. On Saturday June 8, a dumpster will be available in the Maine Township parking lot between 7 am and 7 pm. We can accept furniture, mattresses, and other large household items, but no electronics or hazardous wastes.

Paper Shredding on Saturday, June 15, 9 am to 12 pm

Clean out unneeded accumulated paper and bring it to be shredded in our parking lot at 1700 Ballard Road where your papers will be shredded on site. Please limit your paper materials to 3 plastic or paper grocery-type bags. Make sure to remove all paper clips, binder clips and rubber bands. Staples are acceptable, but spiral notebooks and plastic notebooks will not be accepted.

Other Recycling

In addition, we always have boxes in our Town Hall lobby where you can deposit unused prescriptions, unneeded eyeglasses, plastic bags, and small electronics such as cell phones.

Our goal is to help you dispose of all items responsibly and in an environmentally safe way.

37th Annual Community Paint-A-Thon

The 37th Annual Community Paint-A-Thon will be held on Saturday, September 7, 2024. A rain date is scheduled for Saturday, September 14th. While the date is a long way off, applications are now available! To qualify, homes must be owned and occupied by adults ages 60 and older, those with a permanent disability, or a veteran of any age. There are income and asset limits, but all are encouraged to apply. Applications are due July 1st. Once a home is determined eligible, volunteer teams are matched to do the scraping, priming and painting of the outside of your home. There is no cost to the homeowner. Code Enforcement

Flood Brothers Waste Management Company, who services the unincorporated area, will not accept electronics, such as TV's, computers, printers, and electric devices. Please contact their offices to request a special pick up and fee details. Flood Brothers is required to pick up one bulk item, however any extra items will need to be called in for a special pickup. Another option is to purchase stickers at Maine Township at 1700 Ballard Park Ridge.

Commercial vehicles such as limousines (LY plated), trucks, taxis, camping trailers, motor homes, RV, boats and miscellaneous trailers are illegal to park on any public road, alley, and right of way under the jurisdiction of the Maine Township Highway Commissioner. Any vehicle parked in violation of this ordinance may be towed to a safe storage place, until claimed by the owner.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT NEWS

Hello Maine Township! This past winter the Highway Department has taken full advantage of the waves of unseasonably

warm weather. We have seized the opportunity that we do not normally get to enhance safety measures and foster connectivity within the community.

With an eye on improving the appearance to our area along with maximizing visibility and safety for area children; my staff and I have embarked on a comprehensive review and replacement of signage, crosswalks, and other vital infrastructure near schools in unincorporated Maine Township. This is part of an effort to help make routes to and from school as safe as possible for children and their families. This project has involved engagement with area schools to ensure their input and first-hand knowledge of potential needs is part of the process. Updates to signs, stop walks, crosswalks, sidewalks, lighting, and other improvements will

be worked on throughout the spring and summer.

The Highway Department is also working to connect a sidewalk and bike lane with the Village of Niles and City of Des Plaines through the unincorporated areas of Maine Township and the City of Park Ridge. This project will help enhance accessibility across the entire Township and will help create a safer road environment for cyclists, drivers, and pedestrians.



These priority projects are in addition to the routine maintenance work that the Highway Department performs, including filling potholes, planting/trimming trees, repairing/replacing sidewalks, clearing brush, and managing/improving stormwater drainage systems. We have also had

The County Clerk's Recording Division records, stores, and maintains land records, and other official documents. Cook County residents looking for assistance concerning their home, chain of title, or other land records, can now receive free legal

assistance through a new Legal Help Desk service provided by the Cook County Clerk's Recording Operations Division.

The Legal Help Desk will be staffed by legal aid attorneys from the Center for Disability and Elder Law (CDEL) who will provide pro bono legal advice for customers on matters such as:

- Deed Counseling
- Grantor/Grantee Affidavit
- Corrective Recording Affidavit
- Disclaimer of Interest Form
- Surviving Tenant Affidavit
- Transfer on Death Instrument (TODI)

The Legal Help Desk is available on the third Thursday of every month at the Clerk's office, 118 N. Clark Street in Chicago. Appointments are mandatory and can be scheduled by emailing recording.helpdesk@cookcountyil.gov OR calling them at 312-603-5050.
