This month I would like to highlight our

General Assistance Department. While this Department primarily serves lowincome members of our community, it also provides an invaluable service to anyone who is on Medicare or who will soon sign up for Medicare.

### **Senior Health Insurance Program**

The Senior Health Insurance Program (SHIP), is a free unbiased statewide health insurance counseling service for Medicare beneficiaries and their caregivers. SHIP certified counselors are people who have been trained to assist seniors to understand and choose the best Medicare plan for them. We are pleased to have a SHIP certified counselor on our staff who can help residents select the best Medicare option for them - be it a traditional Supplemental Plan or an Advantage Plan. If you are new to Medicare, you will want to make sure you understand the difference between these types of plans. If you have been on Medicare for a while, you probably know that every fall you have an opportunity to change Medicare plans. Our SHIP counselor can help you with that choice too.

### **General Assistance**

Maine Township provides a variety of benefits to residents who have low income. Maine Township's General Assistance program was created to serve the needs of financially distressed residents and to prevent temporary financial difficulty from becoming a devastating life event. The Department strives to help Maine Township residents get back on their feet as quickly as possible by assisting those who are able to find meaningful employment. We simultaneously provide assistance in

the form of financial subsidies to be used for personal essentials, rent, transportation, and utilities. Recipients must (1) be an adult with no minor children, (2) live within the boundaries of Maine Township, (3) have little to no income and depleted assets, and (4) be searching for work or have a pending disability case.

### **Emergency Rent Assistance**

This program provides one-time financial assistance. In order to apply, a resident must provide proof of a five-day notice or letter from their landlord showing that the resident is behind on their rent, complete an application, and provide all other required documents.

### **Energy Assistance**

Beginning in the fall of each year, our Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) can help low-income persons with a one-time credit toward their winter utility bills.

### **Prescription Discount Program**

A free Coast2CoastRx Discount Prescription Card provides a discount on prescriptions. It covers drugs not covered in health plans along with many pet prescriptions.

# Public Aid Advocacy for Medicaid and Food Stamps

If you want help filling out forms to apply for Public Aid or Medicaid, one of our experienced staffers will be happy to assist you.

#### **Transportation**

Maine Township sponsors a subsidized taxicab program entitled MaineLines. It helps low-income residents pay for transportation in and around Maine Township. Disabled persons and seniors may also qualify for a card entitling them to free RTA rides. In addition, we can also provide discounts on Secretary of State License Plate Stickers.

### **Summer Camp Scholarships**

The Maine Township Reilly-Bialczak Scholarship Fund was created to provide an opportunity for the children of residents who are encountering financial hardship to participate in local park district summer camps. Children must be 18 years of age or younger to be eligible. Students over age 18 who are currently enrolled in high school as a full-time student are also eligible.

#### **Senior and Disabled Services**

Senior and disabled citizens are an integral and vital part of the Maine Township community. Maine Township has a Senior Disabled Advocate who acts as a clearing house for programs sponsored not only by the township, but also by the state, county, and local government. Any Maine Township resident who finds himself or herself in a difficult financial, medical, or personal situation may visit our office and speak to one of our trained staff to find out what kind of services may be available to them.

# HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT NEWS

### Ed Beauvais, Highway Commissioner

Hello everyone! We have had quite the busy spring and early part of summer here at the Highway Department. The

theme so far has been planning and planting.

Our summer project planning has been finalized and we are moving forward with paving and concrete contract work after bidding was completed. We continue to prioritize school zone safety. Part of this year's roadway maintenance project includes re-striping of roadway, stop bars, dividing lines and crosswalks to increase pedestrian/child safety and visibility around Township area school zones.

We are very pleased to announce that the Highway Department will be bringing in an additional \$350,000 of funding from the State of Illinois after working alongside State leaders to make that a reality. Thank you to our area Senator Laura Murphy for helping to secure these funds for Maine Townships' unincorporated area residents and for helping to increase our productivity and output as a department!

We are also actively and aggressively pursuing County and Federal grant funding to help increase resident requested drainage and infrastructure growth in and around Township roadways. This has the potential to double the annual amount of monies we are able to dedicate to sidewalk, drainage, right of way and other roadway infrastructure improvements.

During the past few months, I have prioritized parkway tree restoration. Since April, our staff has planted close to 70 trees throughout the Township! Also, in our second year holding environmentally

positive giveaway events; this year we partnered locally with Pesches and the Izaak Walton League of Des Plaines to hold a 'plant a pollinator' community giveaway event. This was done with the hopes of improving our surrounding local ecosystem. Over 100 area residents were able to

### 2023 Second Installment Property Tax Bills Should Be Mailed on Time for First Time Since 2019 Tax Year

The 2023 Second Installment Property Tax Bills are anticipated to be mailed on July 1, 2024. The tax bill will be due on August 1, 2024. This marks the first time since 2019 that the property tax bills will be sent out on time.

For the past few years, taxpayers have experienced delays in the mailing of property tax bills, causing confusion and inconvenience, especially for taxpayers with an escrow. The timely mailing of the property tax bills is crucial for the financial planning of both taxpayers and the county.

It is critical for all property owners to carefully review their 2023 Second Installment Property Tax Bills to ensure that all entitled exemptions appear correctly on their bills. Common exemptions include but are not limited to; the Homeowner, Senior, Low-Income Senior Citizens Assessment Freeze, Persons with Disabilities, and Veterans with Disabilities.

If you find that any of your entitled exemptions are missing from your property tax bill, contact the Maine Township Assessor's Office.

Be sure to make a timely payment by August 1, 2024 to avoid penalties. The bill can be paid at any Chase Bank, online at the Cook County Treasurer's website, or by mail to the Treasurer.
