Maine Township also provides periodic educational events such as Cook County Sheriff classes on self-defense and avoiding scams, Cook County Clerk classes on finding pending cases, Cook County Assessor classes on appealing your property taxes, and Niles-Maine Library classes on internet safety.

We also host annual events that provide other services our residents need such as paper shredding, electronics recycling and "Dumpster Days," when residents can dispose of large items. In addition, we always have boxes in our Town Hall lobby where you can deposit unused prescriptions, unneeded eyeglasses, plastic bags, and small electronics such as cell phones. Our Community Garage Sale also allows you to sell items you do not need (while buying new treasures). All of these services help you dispose of unneeded items responsibly and in an environmentally safe way.

General Assistance

Our General Assistance department helps senior and disabled income eligible residents receive a discount on their license plate sticker. If you're a senior needing help navigating Medicare, don't hesitate to meet with our SHIP certified Senior and Disability Advocate. Our LIHEAP energy assistance program for gas and electric bill assistance for low income residents will officially begin as of October 2, 2023. There will be two priority periods where only select households will be eligible to apply before the program is offered to all eligible Cook County residents.

The first priority group, beginning October 2, 2023 are households with a senior who is 60 or older, person(s) with a disability and families with children under the age of six years.

The second priority group, beginning November 1, households disconnected from one or both utilities or in danger of being disconnected from one or both utilities can apply for energy assistance benefits. Beginning December 1, all other households may apply for the energy assistance program.

I am pleased to announce that our department can now renew your license plates right here at Maine Township.

To purchase your sticker, you will need:

- Illinois Vehicle Registration Renewal Notice or Vehicle Identification Number (VIN)
- Driver's license number and license plate number
- If using the Benefit Access Program, the Benefit Access discount control number will be needed to receive your registration fee discount when purchasing license plates or a renewal sticker

Convenience fee for each renewal is \$7 (charged by Maine Township to cover processing.)

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT NEWS

Ed Beauvais, Highway Commissioner

What a busy summer we have had. It has been a pleasure meeting many of you this year at community events and

throughout our neighborhoods. It has been challenging but also extremely rewarding to help solve some of the issues that we have faced together and have arisen within our jurisdiction.

I have implemented an annual community survey in which we will use every year to help dictate the priorities and direction of Highway Department projects and resources. This year we received an overwhelming response from the community and after compiling survey results, unincorporated residents have once again placed drainage and flood control at the top of their priority list.

I am happy to announce that we have just completed a major drainage project in the area northwest of Greenwood and Ballard Rd. along with many area road improvements. We hope that these improvements provide relief to area residents, and we look forward to utilizing additional State funded relief opportunities as we plan for next year's projects. I look forward to continuing to see you all out and about at fall and winter community events and hearing your input on how we can improve as a local entity.

Since Fall has now arrived and winter is not far behind, we ask residents to please take the following precautions: When contracting with snow removal providers, please make them aware that snow removed from your driveway or sidewalk, is to be placed on your property, not Maine Township Highway Department right-of-way or in the street (see Maine Township Ordinance to avoid paying violation fee). If your mailbox is in the right-of-way, make sure to request that a path be made to allow the post office to deliver your mail. If you are elderly and have difficulty moving, plan ahead with family members, friends, neighbors or with local community contacts who can assist you in delivering your mail or other needs during times of inclement weather. Ice provides many safety challenges for us all, so you may wish to keep a bag of salt or snow melter handy to keep your stoop and pathway to your

parked vehicle clear when temperatures fall below 32 degrees. Wearing weatherfriendly shoes/boots helps but always be careful when walking out in the elements.

Maine Township Highway Department trucks are large/ heavy and driving on ice and snow can be challenging. Please be wary of the drivers' blind spots and do

not try and pass one of our trucks when it is plowing or spreading salt. For everyone's safety, while it may be tempting to try and stop the snowplow truck in the street to speak with the driver, instead, please call the highway department office with any questions or concerns.

You may also report any abandoned cars parked on your street to Maine Township Code Enforcement Officer (847) 297-2510 x259. If a stop sign is down, please call the office during working hours Monday through Friday or if after hours on holiday or weekends, report to the Cook County Sheriff's Office (847) 635-1188.

If you observe a large pooling of water or iced over spot on sidewalk or right-of-way, it may be possible that there is a water main break. If located in unincorporated Maine Township, please notify the water company Aqua 24-hour Phone# (877) 987-2782.

If you park your vehicle on the street, you may wish to carry a small shovel to clean the area surrounding your vehicle after snow is plowed on the street to allow for easier access to your parked vehicle. Do not park your vehicle in restricted parking areas, as your vehicle may be towed, and you will be responsible for towing fees. Also, please pay close attention to snow route signs for over two inches of snowfall. If your vehicle is towed, you may call Gene's Village Towing at (847) 537-9693.

If you are unable to get ahold of us in the office, please leave a VM with your name, address, and phone number. Your call will normally be returned within 24 hours Monday–Thursday, messages left on Friday will be returned on Monday. For quickest response email us at highway@mainetown.com or if you prefer call to request an appointment. To report an emergency, please call 911.

2022 Second Installment Property Tax Bills Mailing in November

2022 Second Installment Property Tax bills, payable in 2023, will be late this year. The bills will be mailed in November. The new triennial reassessment value will be used to calculate this bill. Once it has been released by the Cook County Treasurer, taxpayers can view, pay, and print out a copy of their property tax bills. The Second Installment will be due in December. Second Installment property tax bills include property tax exemptions calculated by the Cook County Assessor and local tax rates calculated by the Cook County Clerk. It is important to review these bills to ensure your exemptions are correctly posted. For the tax year 2022, taxpayers eligible for the Low-Income Senior Freeze application must reapply, as it will not auto-renew. If you do not see your exemptions, please contact my office for assistance at 224-257-4830.
