Hope you are enjoying this beautiful summer weather! It has been so much fun seeing many of you in person at our outdoor tent events.



Did You Know....?

Who Made That Charcoal Briquette

In the summer of 1919, Michigan real estate agent Edward Kingsford and Henry Ford traveled to the UP in Michigan so Ford could buy land to produce his own timber for his cars. Ford built a sawmill and parts plant in Iron Mountain, MI, along with a neighboring town – named Kingsford – to house the workers.

In addition to the lumber, the mill generated waste in the form of stumps, branches and sawdust. Ford hated to be wasteful, so he used the expertise of chemist Orin Stafford, who had invented a method for making lumps of fuel from sawdust and mill waste combined with tar and bound together with cornstarch. Stafford called them "charcoal briquettes."

A briquette factory was built next to the sawmill and Kingsford ran it. It produced 610 lbs. of briquettes for every ton of scrap wood. At the beginning, the charcoal was sold to smokehouses, but supply exceeded demand. By the mid-1930s Ford was marketing "Picnic Kits" containing charcoal and portable grills to market the link between motoring and outdoor adventure.

The idea of the "modern picnic" didn't take off until after WWII, thanks to suburban migration, the invention of the Weber grill and the marketing efforts of the businessmen who bought Ford Charcoal in 1951. They renamed it Kingsford Charcoal and persuaded major supermarket chains to carry it. By 1963, barbecues, like cars, were icons of American leisure.




Mind Games 2 - The Science of Curious Thinking Presented By: William Pack




Outdoor Tailgate Bingo






Outdoor Tailgate Bingo
