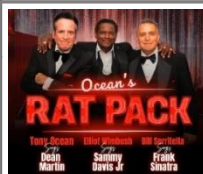

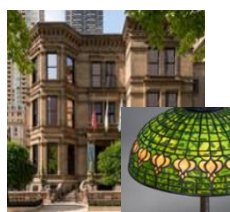

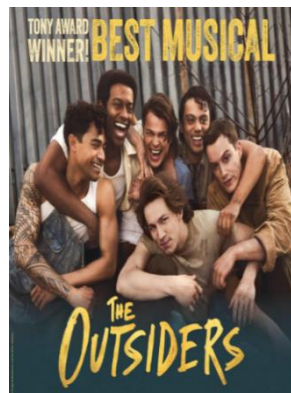

In the early 1920s, Chicago was gripped by a wave of so-called "lady killers." Most were women who had suffered domestic violence and acted in self-defense, quickly acquitted by sympathetic juries. But a few stood out as glamorous "ladies of the gun"—guilty, beautiful, and unrepentant. Socialite **Belva Gaertner** shot her married lover in his car, later claiming she couldn't remember a thing. **Beulah Annan** invited her secret boyfriend over while her husband was at work and shot him after a drunken quarrel. **Kitty Malm** joined her lover in a botched factory robbery that ended in tragedy. These women shared a jail cell with **Sabella Nitti**; an innocent immigrant wrongly accused of murder. Their well-known cases inspired the hit play *Chicago*.

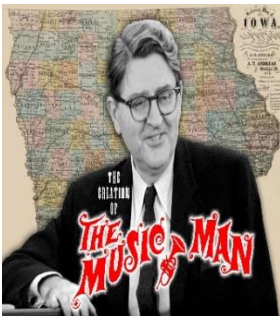
